NARRATIVE:

Between November 4TH, 2018 and November 7TH, 2018, numerous graffiti "tags" appeared throughout the city. Among the locations vandalized were multiple residences, multiple businesses, City Hall, City Hall Park, and also multiple signs, dumpsters, and mailboxes throughout the city.

After a weeklong investigation by the Burlington Street Crimes Unit (SCU), investigators identified Ian J. Coleman (23 yoa) of Burlington as the person responsible. Investigators interviewed Coleman, who made statements admitting his role in multiple vandalism incidents.

Coleman was issued a citation for multiple counts of Unlawful Mischief and will be issued civil graffiti tickets at a later date.

There is no arrest photograph for Coleman on file.
