Hi Jack,
I am largely without cell/wifi coverage while on vacation.

However, I did want to convey to you and Scott Gustin and the BCB – that I had a chat with Bill Nedde and confirmed that the impervious (both redeveloped and new) will receive full 2002 VSWMM treatment in the North Campus pond, with the modification/enlargement of the forebay.

Thus, I am not overly concerned with the stormwater management for this project. I would still like to know if FAHC is planning on including some green infrastructure components for the project. I am not going to make these a requirement per se of the project and Chapter 26 compliance (I still need to see full EPSC plans prior to earth disturbance).

Perhaps a better use of the projects investment would be to find some other stormwater improvement(s) – such as stabilization of the goat path that heads down from the FAHC area to Colchester Avenue – or perhaps FAHC would want to invest in a project that treats some other untreated impervious that drains to Centennial Brook to leverage the project. That sort of thing will have to be discussed when I return (and/or perhaps the BCB can suggest some ideas).

Again, I would love to see any intentional use of permeable pavers etc – but not in a forced way that necessarily requires UD's etc.
