ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL OR STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

Massing - Square block with central two story pavilion terminating in shed dormer.

Fenestration - 1/1 sash, Queen Anne sash. Plain architrave and wood sills.

Entrance - In the pavilion which is canted on the 1st floor. 1 x 3 bay front porch.

Enrichments - Corner pilasters, "Tuscon" columns.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

This is a typical Colonial Revival styled house built after the turn of the century. It maintains the scale and cohesiveness of the streetscape. It was built c. 1910 for George Sanderson, a travelling salesman.
