



## SEX OFFENDER RELEASE NOTIFICATION May 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2019









On May 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019, Mr. Lee Tucker will be released from incarceration. Upon his release, Mr. Tucker plans to reside in South Burlington, VT where he will be under the supervision of the Vermont Department of Corrections-Burlington Probation and Parole. Mr. Tucker was arrested in December 2003 and in June 2005 Mr. Tucker was sentenced to 12 - 25 years of incarceration for 2 counts of aggravated sexual assault of a juvenile female.

According to the Vermont Department of Corrections, compared to other incarcerated sex offenders, Mr. Tucker's general risk to commit a new crime is considered to be in the moderate range. Mr. Tucker's risk to commit a new sexual offense is considered to be in the moderate/low category. Additionally, Mr. Tucker has been deemed High Risk by the Vermont DOC Sex Offender High Risk Committee.

Based on offender history, if he were to sexually re-offend, his likely victims would be minor females between the ages of three and fifteen that are known to him. Mr. Tucker will be listed on the VT Sex Offender Registry and upon release will be considered compliant with treatment.
