NARRATIVE:

During the early morning hours of Sunday September 27, 2020, the Burlington Police Department Emergency Communication Center received calls from multiple individuals in the area of Battery Street Jeans located at 115 College Street. The callers reported they heard the sound of glass shattering. Our dispatchers relayed to responding officers that one of the callers was inside the business being burglarized.

Responding officers discovered a glass door of Battery Street Jeans had been completely shattered out. Sgt. Delgado, a shift supervisor, quickly assessed the scene and obtained additional information from those on scene. To secure the scene safely, multiple officers were needed.

As officers entered the building, a subject was observed inside and contact was made. The subject refused directions from the officer and retreated further into the building. Officers began negotiations with the individual to come out. Approximately 30 minutes later, the subject surrendered to officers without incident. The suspect identified as Edward Lamson, is a 21-year old male from Winooski, VT. He was taken into custody, processed, and lodged at the Northwestern Correctional Facility on the charge of Burglary.

Mr. Lamson’s criminal history indicated the following previous criminal charges:
