Today, the Burlington Police Department released a new informational video on our Community Support Liaisons (CSLs).

Community Support Liaisons are part of the <u>Crisis</u>, <u>Advocacy</u>, <u>Intervention Programs (CAIP)</u>. This unit addresses conditions that do not always require police intervention but have a public safety and public health component. CSLs respond to real time calls for service on issues related to mental health, substance use disorder, and homelessness. As embedded social workers, CSLs provide temporary case management and take part in proactive prevention work connected to public safety.

"We show up, we're there, we show up to scenes. We go out into the community, we walk down Church Street, we go into City Hall Park. We make connections with people. We answer the phones here when someone has a question and they don't know who else to call, so they call us."
