The Burlington Police Department has released the newest informational video featuring our Community Service Officers (CSOs).

Community Service Officers are unarmed, unsworn officers who respond to quality-oflife service calls. Working a rotation of days, evenings, nights, and weekends, CSOs perform a variety of tasks in support of law enforcement activities.
